# YALE SCHOOL OF LAW

## REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

Candidates for the degree of LL.B. must be graduates of approved colleges and must submit applications on forms furnished by the School at least four weeks prior to the opening of the term for which admission is sought. Applicants must submit transcripts of their college records and two letters of recommendation. A personal interview and a law aptitude examination will also be required if permission to complete the application is granted. Applicants who have been excluded from other law, graduate, or professional schools for deficiency in scholarship are not eligible.

A limited number of students otherwise qualified may be granted credit for not more than one year of study of high quality at an approved law school.

Applications for graduate study will be received from persons who are primarily interested in law teaching or government service and who have obtained a college degree and a law degree with high rank from recognized institutions. Fellowships available for such study will be granted in deserving cases.

## ACCELERATED PROGRAM

At present the School is operated on an accelerated program of three terms of fifteen weeks each per calendar year. Completion of six of these terms is required for the LL.B. degree. This accelerated program will be discontinued at the end of the Fall Term of 1946, except that there will be a Spring and a Summer Term in 1947 for students who have matriculated in the School in 1946. The first admission date for new students after the Fall Term of 1946 will be in the fall of 1947.

*Spring*—February 18 to June 8, 1946

*Summer*—July 1 to October 12, 1946

*Fall*—October 21 to February 15, 1947

## EQUIPMENT

The Sterling Law Buildings, the headquarters of the School of Law, are the gift of the trustees of the estate of John W. Sterling, B.A. 1864, and were completed in 1931. They occupy the entire block bounded by Wall, High, York, and Grove Streets. On the High Street side are offices, seminar rooms, lecture halls, auditorium, and library space for about 420,000 volumes. The remaining buildings are normally devoted to dormitory and living quarters for students and a portion of the faculty. The Law Library contains about 296,000 volumes. Additions are made at the rate of 10,000 to 12,000 volumes a year.
